The Faithful Bridge

The message of salvation has been described in many ways by many Christians through many years. I remember in college being told that humanity stands on one side of a canyon and God on the other side. No amount of effort on our part could get us from our side to God's side. We must rely on God's initiative, which we see in God building a bridge to span the canyon, uniting humanity and God. That bridge, drawn in the shape of a cross, is Jesus Christ. We walk across this bridge by faith, believing that Jesus will hold us step by step to the very end.

It is guite a simple picture, imagining Jesus as a bridge, and at the same time profound, especially as Christmas approaches. On Christmas we celebrate God's initiative in reaching down to us. God becomes human. The Church has affirmed through the centuries that in Jesus we find both full divinity and full humanity. Jesus is fully God and fully human. But what does this have to do with bridges?

The thing about bridges over canyons is that they need to be anchored on both sides. A bridge that is not securely anchored is a bridge that will fail to carry people safely across. Jesus, however, is a faithful bridge. Anchored in heaven as the fully divine Son of God, anchored on earth as the manger-born son of Mary, the Incarnation qualifies Jesus to become the perfect and eternal bridge between God and humanity.

That bridge was tried and tested through a perfect life, a faithfulness unto death, and a victory in resurrection. Jesus showed us the way to God, God confirmed it every step of the way, and we therefore can put our faith in him. Jesus truly is the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through him. Bridges come and go, but this bridge will last through eternity.

This month, let us remember the Salvation of the world came into the world in this child, Jesus of Nazareth. The Incarnation forged a path, and is the bridge, for our very salvation.

Children/Youth Team


