All Things to All People

To the Jews I became like a Jew, to win the Jews. To those under the law I became like one under the law (though I myself am not under the law), so as to win those under the law. To those not having the law I became like one not having the law (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law), so as to win those not having the law. To the weak I became weak, to win the weak. I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some. I do all this for the sake of the gospel, that I may share in its blessings.

1 Corinthians 9:20-23

One of the most extraordinary qualities about Paul is his single-minded commitment in proclaiming the Gospel to every person in the world. No excuses. No distractions. No mater what. In the passage above, he claims that

he is so committed that he is willing to give up his own freedoms for the sake of the Gospel!

For Americans, this can be quite unpalatable as our freedoms enshrined in the Constitution and Bill of Rights are sacrosanct. We are taught to be willing to sacrifice our very lives to protect these freedoms. For Christians, however, (and Paul being a remarkable Christian example), we are called to sacrifice our very lives AND freedoms for the sake of Jesus and the Gospel we herald.

The world is emerging from a devastating pandemic, and authorities are growing more willing to lift the pandemic restrictions. Mount Hermon has begun amending our guidelines and will continue to do so in a gradual and methodical way. And while many of us are vaccinated and eager to move beyond quarantine, we must remember our sisters and brothers who cannot for various reasons. And we must remember those who want to visit Mount Hermon for the first time but unsure if it would be safe. We must remember the immunocompromised. We must remember the children who as of yet are unable to get vaccines. And we must remember their parents.

What would Paul say about this transition that our church is in with both the vaccinated and the vulnerable wanting to worship and hear the Gospel? I imagine it would sound a bit like his exhortation to the Corinthian church. We must be willing to do whatever it takes to have the Gospel propagate through the world. If that means wearing a small piece of fabric over our mouths or forgoing a freedom for a season, why not jump at such a small sacrifice for the sake of our neighbor?

Paul reminds us that our sacrifices "for the sake of the gospel" are not without reward. In fact, Jesus also promises that whatever we give up for the sake of the Gospel, we will receive one hundred fold (Mark 10:29-30). Now that is a pretty good investment! Church, let us have an eternal perspective and invest in the Gospel. Let us make it easier for others to hear the Gospel, not harder. And let us offer our very selves to make that happen!
