Pastor's Pen

Baptized Into His Death

Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his. For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body ruled by sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin--because anyone who has died has been set free from sin. Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. (Romans 6:3-8 NIV)

We will be celebrating several baptisms in the coming weeks. It is the next step in discipleship after one makes the most important step of following Jesus Christ. While you may chose to follow Christ in a more private setting, baptism allows you to proclaim that decision publicly, to everyone, including your family and friends.

The Greek word for baptize means to dip, to immerse, or to clean by washing. These are all important images when considering baptism. Jesus has command us to be baptized (Matthew 28:18-20), but to understand baptism I suggest going to Romans 6. There, Paul connects our baptism to the baptism of Jesus. But not the one at the Jordan River, but the one on Calvary's Hill.

On the cross, Jesus is immersed by death. Those who choose to follow Christ must follow him every step of the way, including this. Are you ready to put to death your former life so that God can raise you to new life? In baptism we demonstrate this by lowering the disciple into the water as we would lower a body into a grave. The disciple has chosen to give one's very life to follow Jesus.

But just as Jesus did not stay in the grave, the disciple is raised up from the waters to demonstrate that God has raised him/her up to new life, a life that will be lived for Jesus. We are united with Jesus in death. We are united with Jesus in new life. knowing that we are guided by the one who has defeated death and holds eternal life in his hand. Encourage those who are considering this decision, and cheer on those who will make it in the coming weeks.
