Christian Love

As I walked by a storefront I noticed a small sign for sale, the kind that one would hang on a door or kitchen wall. It said, "Love is all you need." It made me wonder what we Christians have to say about love and its necessity in life. We do worship a God who is love, so naturally a sign like this is a wonderful invitation to discuss the God we love.

Our culture defines love in many ways. We see love defined as simply respecting one another's boundaries. "You do not go onto my property, and I will not go onto your property, and that makes good neighbors." Or perhaps the love we encounter seeks to not offend. "In polite conversation, avoid controversial issues and do not challenge other's opinions." Or love is merely tolerating others. "Let them live their own life. Who are you to tell another person how to live?"

We can all agree that these versions of love are lacking and barely begin to define the kind of love we find in Scripture. Christian love is active, moving, generative. When we encounter Christian love, it leaves a mark that does not soon disappear. In the case of Jesus, these marks remain on his hands and feet. In response, we carry the mark of undying gratitude.

I was once again struck by the nature of Christian love while reading a book with our youth pastor, John DeWitt, about the dangers and pitfalls that small churches face. One of the greatest of these is lacking Christian love. The book reminded us that *Christian love is sacrificial love*. Jesus tells his disciples, "My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." (John 15:12-13 NIV)

Christian love is Sacrificial love. Jesus teaches us how to love this way through the way he lives. Jesus has taught Mount Hermon how to love this way. Christian love is not giving of our abundance. It is giving of our very selves. Mount Hermon has reminded me of sacrificial love many times. May we continue to exemplify this love in our community.
