Pastor's Pen

In Christ

Have you ever come across the phrase, "in Christ" while reading the New Testament? It is used dozens of times in ways that might have us pass it over but when considered can be guite confusing.

Consider these verses from Paul and Peter. "Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus," (Romans 8:1 NIV) "Peace to all of you who are in Christ." (1 Peter 5:14 NIV) You could probably guess that "in Christ" in these verses refers to Christians. In fact, this was a way to describe Christians, more often than simply using the word, "Christian." Perhaps the reason is that "in Christ" communicates so much more than a label.

In Galatians, Paul uses "in Christ" to describe our identity in much deeper ways.

So in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. Galatians 3:26-28 NIV

As Christians we are enveloped by Christ Jesus, so much so that his identity becomes our identity! Christ Jesus is the Son of God? We too are children of God! The first thing that God sees when looking at us is Jesus Christ as we are clothed with Christ. Furthermore, since we are all "in Christ," our differences fade away. Your ethnicity, social status, gender, and everything else that comprised your identity before being "in Christ" take a back seat to your principal identity in Christ.

Recently a few young adults at Mount Hermon were commiserating over the allure of Social Media determining our identity. No matter our age, we all want to be liked, and it is tempting to find our identity (and tweak our identity) based off of responses we get online. Did you receive dislikes from a post? Stay away from that. Did you receive likes? Post more of that. Without a secure identity "in Christ," we will be tossed to and fro by the winds of Social Media. Social Media has become one of the greatest threats to a genuine Christian identity to those living today.

How do we counter this threat? Well, it is probably a good first step to limit your time on Social Media. Instead, fill this time with interactions that remind you of your principal identity "in Christ." Read Ephesians, Philippians, and Colossians. Write down every time you find "in Christ." Pray over these verses. Finally, spend time with others in Christ who remind you of your true identity. Doing these things, remembering that your identity is secure in Christ Jesus, will transform how you live in this world and with others. In Christ, Pastor Rich

OUTREACH

The very last words spoken to us by Jesus just before he left His earthly ministry behind are recorded in Acts 1:8. He tells us that we will receive power from the Holy Spirit and we will be His witnesses, telling people about Him everywhere. In our neighborhood, in our community, in our region, and in all the earth. That in a nutshell is what a Christ centered church is to be about. Not what it looks like but what is does. We want to prepare to respond by engaging that training opportunity. That of course can take us to places all over the US. That is an example of what our Samaria might look like.

Finally the earth might look like Guatemala to some of us. We are in contact with Roger and Vicki Grossman and have reserved a week the end of February to go and work on the children's home. Of course we can only respond when He opens doors, because we can only go and be effective in places where His Spirit directs. How we know and understand is simply pray and seek His guidance and then comes the power.
