But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, putting on faith and love as a breastplate, and the hope of salvation as a helmet. (1 Thessalonians 5:5, 8 NIV)

Children of Light

I always appreciate when Daylight Saving Time ends. I can once again wake up with the sun (and the crows of my rooster) instead of an alarm that compels me to start my day in darkness. Of course, this only staves off the inevitable. The nights continue to lengthen, and the days grow shorter. In this month of December we experience the shortest days and the longest nights of the whole year. It seems like the sun is working harder to rise and the night chases the sun away earlier each evening that passes. But that will change soon.

We Christians are living in the last days. The days are dark, and sometimes we can get discouraged and lose hope. But all of a sudden, in the darkest days of the year, a light shines in the darkness. An Advent light. And a second shines. And a third and fourth. And suddenly the world is filled with light!

We are in the midst of the Advent season as you read this article. We have probably lit a couple Advent candles so far. As the Jews read the prophets so long ago and found hope that a Messiah was to come to redeem the world, so we can join them in our hope for the Messiah to come in these last days. For us Christians, we discover that the light that rekindles our hope in the darkness is none other than Jesus Christ. He proclaimed one dark night in Jerusalem, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life (John 8:12)."

Jesus is coming soon. Until then, we are to walk in the light. Let us throw off any darkness in our life and pursue light. It might be hard in these dark days, but the world is counting on you. You may be the only light a friend, a neighbor, or an enemy sees in this world. Show them that there is still hope in this world, and that hope is Jesus.




