A Case for Christ

In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven. Matthew 5:16 NIV

As you read this, our Guatemala Team is probably midway through their mission, returning in a few days. We eagerly anticipate hearing their experiences with the Good Shepherd Ministries in Quetzaltenango, Guatemala as they share testimonies during the first few Sundays in March.

The Church is experiencing explosive growth in the southern hemisphere, namely Central and South America and Africa. There are now more Christians living in this area of the world than all of North America, Europe, and Russia combined! At the same time the number of those who identify as Christian here in the US has been falling, precipitately so in the last few years. Why is this the case? Most likely there are a number of reasons, but as we enter the season of Lent, let us consider one.

One reason why fewer and fewer identify as Christians around us is the poor example that many Christians provide for what it means to follow Jesus. When Christians see their commitments to Jesus starting and ending on Sunday mornings, living differently throughout the week, does that inspire others to such a faith? When Christians seem more loyal to a political party, even to the point of defending the obvious sins of politicians, does that point seekers to a heavenly calling? When Christians are so passionate about a righteous vision for society that they forget to love their neighbors, will our neighbors be drawn to Jesus? In the words of a friend, "If this is what being a Christian means, why would I ever consider it? No, thank you." Or to use a quotation often attributed to Mahatma Gandhi, "I like your Christ, I do not like your Christians. Your Christians are so unlike your Christ."

What is our response to these sentiments? We can grow defensive and continue down a path of Christian obsolescence. Or we can respond with personal and corporate contrition, longing to be more like Jesus. We must embody a Christianity that transforms how we live every second of our lives, where all other loyalties are subsumed under that of Jesus Christ, and where love is the first impulse in all situations. Lent is an opportunity to return to our first love, not only for our sake but the sake of those around us. Our testimonies may be the most powerful case our neighbors may confront regarding Christianity, for or against.



We have hired a new Bookkeeper who is working to catch up our financial reports. We have closed out the 2021 Giving/Offering reports for tax reporting. If vou were expecting a report and did not receive one by picking it up at the church or receiving it by mail contact the church office.

At the December business meeting it was voted to begin the repayment of \$32,000 borrowed from the Church Money Market account for the parsonage renovation. The repayment will be made from the Property Renovation Fund in the amount of \$534/ month for 5 years. Payments for January and February have been made. Please consider increasing your giving with a contribution to the PRP fund.

In the past 3 months there has been an emphasis on giving to Youth Missions. The fundraisers and gifts have totaled \$5242 to date. \$3200 was used to send Blanca and Daniel to Guatemala with the Mission Team. The remaining funds will go toward Passport Camp and/or other missions events as needed.

Thank you all for your generous support of our children and look forward to other fundraising events in the future!
