Pastor's Pen

Our Holy Gospel

If we were asked to explain the Gospel, many of us Christians would make sure to include a few key parts. Firstly, that God loves us, but we have been separated from God because of sin. Our actions have consequences, and our rebellion against the righteous life calls us to create a rift between us and God.

Secondly, Jesus Christ, Son of God and Son of Humanity, lives that perfectly righteous life, volunteering to be that representative of all humanity before God. His righteous life causes his death at the hands of a sinful world, but through his death he takes on the sins of the world and their consequences.

Lastly, God vindicated Jesus and defeats sin and death through his resurrection. Those of us who follow Jesus will likewise find reconciliation with God and victory over sin and death, leading to a life with abundance and without end.

I celebrate those who have chosen to follow Jesus, and I encourage those who haven't to take that most important step. To all, however, I must ask what it means to follow Jesus? Perhaps some would say to live a righteous life, rejecting sin when faced with it, but it is so much more than that. Jesus has rescued us, and so we give our whole lives to him. Jesus has a claim on our lives, and his vision for our lives is to be just like him in the world!

We can look to the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, John) if we seek to be like Jesus. He certainly rejected sin, but he also did good everywhere he went, and he proclaimed the Gospel, the good news, of God rescuing the world through Jesus. To forget that God has a mission for you in this world is to acknowledge that, in the words of former president of World Vision Richard Stearns, we have a hole in our Gospel.

What better time than the Easter season to revisit the Gospel and ensure that we embrace the whole Gospel! We will be studying Richard Stearns' book, *The Hole in Our Gospel*, on Wednesday evenings. Do come as we learn to speak the Gospel to one another and live the Gospel with one another without holes.

We have added 6 more prison ministry members to the list to be trained. Without another COVID lock down, we should see a return of ministry to OCC and prayerfully have the men of OCC worshipping with us sometime this summer.

Please pray with those who engage in prison ministry outreach that we will find the joy of obedience in our ministry there.
