

OUTREACH

As you plan your new year, make some time to take the Love of Jesus with you. Remember we are engaged in sharing the saving gospel of God's love for all humanity. That love and the Christ's Spirit empower that outreach.

Our ministry at Orange Correctional Center (OCC) continues to move forward as we look forward to a time when we can bring those men out for worship with us on Sundays and Wednesdays. Our Easter offering traditionally goes to Alamance Orange Prison Ministry. That along with contributions from other local churches provides a full time chaplain to help the men there to walk with Christ while incarcerated and when they earn their freedom. (See Steve Paschall if you would like to receive the training you need to go to OCC and encourage the men there.)

We will send a team to Guatemala in February to help Roger and Vicki Grossman continue building the Good Shepherd Children's Home and develop churches in the surrounding countryside. We have been ministry partners with the Good Shepherd for about 10 years now. Our international missions offering during the Christmas season goes to fund our work there.

Our youth will be on mission this summer in the Kentucky coal fields ministry. They will need our prayers and support for their efforts to take Jesus with them to that mission field.

We look forward to continue our ministry to the Ukraine and Armenia through our partnership with Baptist on Mission. Have you ever worked with our Disaster Relief team in the aftermath of a hurricane? If the answer is no, then you are encouraged to get trained for such a ministry this March.

Of course our most important Mission outreach every year is VBS. Look for John and Abby DeWitt to announce that outreach for a major summer mission event soon.
