Pastor's Pen

The Kingdom of God

Lent is a period of preparation, of fasting and self-denial, of repentance and confession, of putting our spiritual house in order. It is about embracing the Resurrected Christ with a whole and longing heart. And it involves putting some things away so that we can fully claim all that God offers. We are called to consider Jesus' invitation to follow him. Jesus calls us to leave behind much of what we have known and accepted to join him in a journey that continues through every stage of our lives. The invitation is offered to us not only at the start of the life of faith, but it is an offer that is extended to us again and again throughout our journey. We face the Lenten season 2023 glimpsing the promise of resurrection in a way we have never, which also means we can face this remaining "wilderness" with renewed strength and promise.

In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus begins his public ministry with these words: "*The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news*" (Mark 1:15). Whenever Jesus speaks about the kingdom of God coming near, we nod like we understand. But do we really understand? These days are "wilderness" days, filled with chaos, uncertainty, violence. The glimmers of hope we see today certainly seem a far cry from the full-fledged kingdom God promised.

The kingdom of God has come near, Jesus told us. The kingdom of God touches this wilderness road and we can see it in glimpses throughout the journey. But we must be looking. And we must take the time to not just believe the good news, but to embody the good news ourselves.

As we travel in this Easter journey with Jesus to the Cross, let us be intent to bring a greater sense of mercy and justice into our world. We prepare and journey through prayer, repentance, good works, fasting, and sacrifice. We renew our faith and reflect on Jesus' love—His living, dying, and rising from the dead. He is our Savior and our Lord. He has redeemed us from our sins. He gives us eternal life. May God lead us in His way to bring unity and fellowship to us at Mount Hermon Church. My best to you in your journey. You are in my prayers. It is my hope you are praying too.

DISCIPLESHIP

How would you describe God's call on your life and what is it? I was recently asked this question and I had it think about how God has called me even when I wasn't listening. The story is long but I will make this brief. For me, my call has always been in the everyday life happenings that come my way. I have been able to use my gifts of singing to children in the hospital, offer comfort to parents in the most stressful times of their lives, offer hope to parents whose children have special needs because God had given me that call.

What is your call from God? Are you listening? Are you ready to take up that call and do what God is calling you to do? Pray about it. Jehovah Jireh our Provider is going before you preparing the way, getting all you need there before you go. You just have to say yes! ~Cookie Frederick

OUTREACH Here am I, Send Me

As Isaiah saw God when he entered the temple we are allowed to see what happens to mankind when we encounter the Holy God. First we become disheveled, then we seek forgiveness, then we seek service. Missions happens when we answer God's call to share His love with all humanity. That happens in our back yard, down the road, in another community, or in other countries. It's much the same, just sometimes takes us longer to get there. Our model is Acts 1:8.

We are aggressively seeking to become a missions driven church. Last year we studied Richard Stearns' book "The Hole in Our Gospel." He writes: "The idea behind The Hole in Our Gospel is quite simple. It's basically the belief that being a Christian, or a follower of Jesus Christ, requires much more than having a personal and transforming relationship with God. It also entails a public and transforming relationship with the world. If your personal faith in Christ has no positive outward expression then your faith —and mine—has a hole in it."

We want to celebrate missions in this church by developing a missions small group study. The goal is to "pray and obey" (from pastor Cho) God's call to missions. Our motto is that of Isaiah's "send me." We will hold our preparation time during the Sunday School hour beginning in April. If you feel led to follow Christ to the mission field, then join us. Please let me know of your interest in this mission study group. ~Steve Paschall
