Let's tell the truth. Humans cannot live well without resting, so God created the Sabbath. Keeping Sabbath can put things in perspective. It reminds us that we are valued, not because of what we produce, but because we are loved by God. When we take time for Sabbath it helps us to slow down to participate in the rhythm of God's creation. It reminds us that God will provide for our needs. And for a short time we can cease demanding that we have to figure things out ourselves and rely on the Lord to give us the help and resources we need.

To make time for rest and for God, we have to make these a priority over other things. We have to budget into our agendas, time for daily meditation and prayer. Do we have to give ourselves detention for this to happen? Or could we just rest in the arms of the Almighty and find ourselves back in stride with God's creation? The commandment to "keep my Sabbaths and reverence my sanctuary" should be one of the easiest commandments to keep. DISCIPLESHIP

In Pastor David's sermon on Sunday there were a couple of things that he pointed out that I think bear repeating. Luke 24:13-32 is the story of Jesus' appearance on the road to Emmaus. The first thing that struck me was that Jesus led those men in a Bible study (vs 27). He taught them the writings of Moses and the prophets and all things from all the Scriptures that concerned him. He wanted to emphasize that his life and death and resurrection were foretold and that what everyone witnessed was real and true.

The second thing I want to point out is how the hearts of these men burned within them as Jesus taught them and explained the scriptures. Is this what happens when you read and study God's Word? Is your time with the Lord a priority? Do you miss it when it doesn't happen? Do you give him the best you have? I want to challenge you to give God an hour a day. Set it aside as sacred so nothing else interferes with it. Use this time to read and study his Word, listen to his voice, sing praises and worship, be still and know that He is God. The passion you have for the Lord will be alive and burning, you'll hear His voice call you to fulfill specific plans for your life. Then your challenge will be to go and share the gospel with courage just as the men from Emmaus did. Will you accept the challenge? I hope so! ~Cookie Frederick

OUTREACH

April 14-15 offered us a first hand look at missions at home and to the uttermost parts of the earth. It was a model of Jesus instruction in Acts 1:8. I was very proud of Mount Hermon because we had 19 people at the missions conference and everyone of us were truly blessed to be there. Next year, don't miss it. It was a spiritual shot in the heart.

One of the speakers was Lee Strobel who has written books that fix our hearts on Jesus and His kingdom. Most of us are aware of the book "Case for Christ." But he has also published "The Case for Miracles" and "The Case for Heaven." He is one of the foremost evangelist in the US today. This was his message in a small group break out session. He spoke about how we increase the evangelistic effect in our churches. This is simply a bullet report about his message.

It now takes 86 church members to bring 1 person to Christ. This tells us that American churches are not sustainable. 73% of our churches are in decline and only 3% of them are currently growing.

- 1. Leaders must own and model that the lost are valuable to God. "Are we willing to die for the lost?"
- 2. Leaders must instill these evangelistic values to members of the church
- 3. Leaders must empower an evangelistic person keep watch of this vital aspect of outreach. Put one person in charge of this ministry and it's not the pastor
- 4. We can take contagious Christian leader courses on line at his school
- 5. Let passion for evangelism go free. In other words fan the evangelistic fervor to flame

We must create events where evangelism can take place like revivals and VBS.

Well, I hope this sets all of to think about what kind of job Mount Hermon has done in this Spiritual discipline. How many of us can/should be engaged? All of us. Think about it. We better pray about it.
