Pastor's Pen

Wow! Where did last year go? And look how fast we are already traveling into the New Year 2024. It is difficult to focus because everything is moving so quickly. At times we are quite intentional, and at other times, we are quite unintentional. And our views are so different that it is as though we have no focus at all. I have met people so overcome that they have no starting point because it is all a jumble. We can easily identify with a child riding a bike for the first time without training wheels. The child is completely frozen because of fear or indecision. And at other times, we can identify with the person waiting anxiously for a fun event, frustrated by the slowness of time. Time seems to stand in our way.

As a church family, we are challenged to evaluate our focus. We must always be mindful and how well we keep our vision and emphasis. We constantly find ourselves moving in a thousand different directions. And we become so fixated in one direction that we fail to see the things happening around us.

A large danger in the church is what the early church referred to as "being curved in on oneself" or "being focused on oneself." It is easy to focus on what we want, on our schedules, on our priorities. The early church described this type of behavior as sin. And they gave a remedy for the sin. The remedy: Having a clear focus on God and being fully engaged and oriented to what God is doing.

Something amazing happens when we find our direction. Our anxiousness and impatience begin to wane and fade when we link with God and what God is doing. Interestingly, we see more clearly, and, as a result, we live more fully. This is all easier spoken than done. By the grace of God, when we step back, become purposeful, directing our time, talents, and energies towards God, incredible things are possible.

This is true for us as a congregation at Mount Hermon. We are called to prayerfully discern God's call to focus. We can step back from our own agendas and schedules, becoming directed by God. We can thaw when we believe we are stuck. We can accept and extend God's grace even when we are anxious, angry, or upset.

God's desire is to use us, individually and as a faith community, to do amazing things. We will see the outcomes in our own life, the lives around us, and our church and potentially throughout God's kingdom. We are currently in a crucial time, and I invite you to join me in prayer, meditation, reflection, and participation as we seek to acknowledge where we have been focusing, our strengths and weaknesses, our energy. In prayer we will discover where God is calling us. As we move forward, may no one say of our church, "But they just wouldn't FOCUS!" Our Lord will bless us as we focus on His loving grace.

A Fresh Start

Happy New Year everyone! This is the time of year we hear the question: "What is your New Year Resolution?" We see ads for Health Club or Weight Loss Membership. Even some of us are making statements like: "Sure glad 2023 is over and hoping 2024 is better." A New Year: a New ME!!

Most of us want a fresh start. We may look back and think how we could've done some things differently. As creatures of a sinful nature we are going to make mistakes; but there's good news! Christ has come to heal the broken-hearted and to cast off our chains. His power, freedom and healing are in all who call Him, Lord. Isaiah 42 reminds us of this truth.

Isaiah 42:1-12.(NASB) The opening verses describe Christ and how God has anointed him. "Behold, My Servant, whom I uphold; My chosen One in whom My soul delights. I have put My Spirit upon Him; He will bring forth justice to the nations."

Christ, being God, has the power to "get the job done". God gave Him that power. "A bent reed He will not break off and a dimly burning wick He will not extinguish; He will faithfully bring forth justice. He will not be disheartened or crushed until He has established justice on the earth; and the coastlands will wait expectantly for His law." I love this portion because I am sometimes that bent reed or that dimly burning wick yet He will NOT dismiss me. Now that is REAL love! As the saying goes: "I may not be where I need to be but I thank God I am not where I used to be." God will not abandon me to my own vices.

Verses 5-9: God describes all He has done through his creation and in his people. (Showing how we haven't done anything for ourselves - He has done it!) Then He tells Christ, the Messiah of his responsibilities on earth. "I am the LORD, I have called You in righteousness, I will also hold You by the hand and watch over You, and I will appoint You as a covenant to the people, as a light to the nations, to open blind eyes, to bring out prisoners from the dungeon and those who dwell in darkness from the prison" This is the exciting news! He is our power through the Triune God for healing and freedom. He gives us the ability for a Fresh Start.

Then God continues to proclaim WHO He is: "I am the LORD, that is My name; I will not give My glory to another, nor My praise to idols. Behold, the former things have come to pass, now I declare new things; before they sprout I proclaim them to You."

Verses 10-12 exhort us to sing His praise. And why shouldn't we...? We've been given the power to make a Fresh Start through Christ, our Messiah! "Sing to the LORD a new song, Sing His praise from the end of the earth! You who go down to the sea, and all that is in it; you islands, and those who live on them. Let the wilderness and its cities raise their voices, the settlements which Kedar inhabits. Let the inhabitants of Sela sing aloud, let them shout for joy from the tops of the mountains. Let them give glory to the LORD and declare His praise in the coastlands."
