How Big is God to you?



How big is God to us? Quite a question...We sing many songs of His greatness. Here are a few...

How Great is Our God How Great Thou Art Holy, Holy, Holy

Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah Goodness of God

And we are learning a new one - You are Worthy of It All.

How BIG is God to us? When we pray, do we pray expecting God to answer? Not that He'll answer the way <u>we</u> want but THAT He'll answer. Do we doubt He is capable; doubt we are worthy of His time? Most of us would say we don't doubt Him, but our lifestyle or prayer life depicts otherwise.

We've heard that Jesus addresses the Pharisees in Matt. 22: 34-40 with the 2 greatest commandments: Love God with everything that you are and love others as you love yourself. Sometimes, I think we get things out of order. We consider how we love others <u>before</u> how we love God. We worry about pleasing others more than we worry about pleasing God. Our people are bigger than God. BUT we are to love God with EVERYTHING we are and have. If we do that then there's no room for people to take His place.

What does His love look like? God's love is multi-faceted. His commands originate from love; He shows His power because He loves; His justice is grounded in love; His expectations of our hearts, souls and minds are because He loves us and wants what is best for us.

But we won't really know what that looks like until we dive into God's Word with gusto and determination to seek Him with <u>all our hearts</u>. (Jer. 29:13) Then we can better understand Paul's prayer from Eph. 3:14-21. Let's seek God first and His righteousness (Matt. 6:33) so that our God gets Bigger and Bigger.
