If you do not get anything else, get this: LIFE IS PREPARATION FOR ETERNITY.

Ephesians 2:10 says: "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." Missing this message is missing the point of your life. Last month, I posed the question: How Big is God to you? I've thought about that question all month from the view that actions speak louder than words. How do I show His greatness to others? How do I urge others to believe in the God of Colossians 1:15-20. How do I display my confidence in the Creator of the Universe who is also my greatest friend? What does Matthew 22:37-39 look like in my life?

Through all these questions, I have seen that I need to do some Spring Cleaning. I'm reminded that if I love God with all my heart, soul and strength there's no room for selfish, bitter, anxious, fearful, prideful, or unrepentant thoughts. If I want the world to see the Triune God of Col. 1, where everything was created by Him, through Him and for Him, then some things within me need to die or at least need pruning.

When I am reluctant to prune or let something die that is hindering my walk with God, I need to remember that the Son of God gave his very life so that today, like the thief on the cross, I am walking with Jesus in paradise. Luke 23:43 His death has brought me life and not just life; ABUNDANT Life!
