#### Pastor's Pen

As I draft this article our brothers and sisters in Western North Carolina and beyond are faced with recovery from the devastating effects of two successive major hurricanes. Wars continue in our world, and our country just completed a national election that could determine who we are as a nation far beyond the next four years. And we have just observed Thanksgiving, a holiday on which, when possible, we gather with family or friends to give thanks for God's blessings in our lives ...but what about those to whom Jesus referred as "the least of these" (Matthew 25:40)? How mindful at such times are we of them, even in our midst, the lonely and ignored, the homebound and the homeless and the poor, the sick and the worried?

Advent is the perfect time to reach many in our midst with the abundant hope and life found in Christ Jesus.
