#### STEWARDSHIP UPDATE: FACT #2

As we continue our series of articles about stewardship, this month's topic is:

"Types of Offerings: Designated vs. General Fund"

Fact #2: In order for the church to function effectively, offerings given to the General Fund must meet or exceed expenses with a goal of meeting the yearly budget (and not expenses alone).

This statement may seem unnecessary, or just common sense, but in reality, it is important as we think about tithing. When we give to the General Fund (or Budget), we are supporting the church's total operation including:

Discipleship Utilities

Outreach Property Upkeep

Youth Ministry Salaries

Music Ministry
Fellowship Hall Supplies
Missions (see Oct Newsletter)

Ways are also made available to support Designated Funds (e.g., Property Renovation Fund) as well as to additional church-sponsored projects, but the General Fund is the means through which we can carry out the church's purpose and mission.

Much thought and planning goes into arriving at each year's budget. Soon, the Stewardship Committee will be fashioning various budget requests into its 2025 proposed budget. Please be in prayer for this process and for how you can contribute to keeping Mount Hermon's mission alive.
