# Pastor's Pen

To best understand the meaning of the Old Testament and the New Testament Books of Acts, Epistles, and Revelation, one must read and understand the gospels, the heart of the Christian Bible. Even within the gospels, however, our faith is often defined by the birth, death, and resurrection of Jesus, the alpha and omega of Jesus' human life, the celebration of which is our Christmas and Easter experience.

The question I ask of myself often, and ask of you now, is about the focus of our personal reflections and repentance. Are we focused on such matters as our sinfulness and salvation, guided by familiar scriptures like John 3:16 or Romans 8:1-4 and 10:5-10? And are we focused on how our faith is translated into action guided by other scriptures? Scriptures like Mathew 22:37-40, Mark 8:34-35 or James 2:14-18? I reflect that both are essential to Christian discipleship, and that one without the other is lacking to be a faithful follower of Christ. We come together each week to worship God in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit; but does our weekly faith journey begin and end there? Do we faithfully engage also daily or weekly in studying the scriptures, alone or in prayer and devotional groups of one form or another?

Beyond strengthening our faith in these ways, how engaged are we in mercy, justice, and service outreach here among us and in the community beyond our walls, a witness to our faith through action? Mount Hermon offers many opportunities for growth in discipleship. We are alerted always to opportunities through our weekly worship bulletins and email notices, our monthly newsletter, our website, and verbal announcements. My prayer for us at Mount Hermon is that we continue to grow as disciples of Jesus in fellowship with one another, that our faith will be defined by the love of Christ we've personally experienced, the fellowship of His Spirit with us, and the acknowledgment of God's presence in our lives. And it is my prayer that we will extend that love to others in our midst so they too will grow as faithful disciples of Jesus Christ the Lord.

Mount Hermon Baptist Church needs willing hands and committed hearts as we continue to strive together for faithful ministry. To reach the potential God offers us, we are called to dedicate time and energy, and treasure and talent. God calls us to be faithful.

I look forward to seeing you in worship and fellowship. We truly have a blessed community of faith. Join us so we can grow and serve together.

## **OUTREACH**

## A message from Richard Brunson, Executive Director, Baptists on Mission

Thank you for giving to our Hurricane Helene relief efforts in western North Carolina. Because of your generosity, we've been able to offer hope to thousands of people affected by the storm. That hope has come in many forms: a hot meal, a tree being removed, a home mudded out, clothes being washed, or, for some, sitting down with a chaplain. The numbers speak for themselves: • Over 500,000 hot meals have been provided so far! • Over 5.000 recovery jobs completed (chain saw, mud out or tear out, tarps on roofs)! • Over 13,000 volunteers so far."

"We are now moving into the next phase of rebuilding homes. The Essential Rapid Repairs (ERR) program will provide the basics... insulation, flooring, sheetrock, electrical, plumbing, HVAC, a functional kitchen with basic appliances and a bathroom. We'll return to finish the homes later, but we want to get 500-1000 families back into a warm, safe, secure, functioning home before the worst of winter. We will need lots of unskilled and skilled volunteers. There is a critical need for licensed plumbers, electricians and people with construction skills because all this work must be done to code, working with county building inspectors. We'll also need hundreds of people willing to assist in many ways. Please encourage volunteers to sign up at www.helenerebuild.org. Thank you for praying, giving and going in response to Hurricane Helene. The impact of this storm will be felt for many years. Thank you for your support."

# A message from Tim Etheridge, President, Baptists on Mission

"Disaster: God is in Control: With people in need, we, as Baptists, need to be the hands and feet of Jesus. We can volunteer to help those in need, pray for those in need, and/or give to assist those in need. In James 2, we are told that faith without works is dead. As Christians, we are called servants to help those suffering from the impact of Helene. While volunteering with NC Baptists on Mission, we can help with physical needs like removing trees, cleaning out flooded homes, or putting a tarp on a leaking roof. This allows us to show God's love. While serving in the yellow shirts, we are often asked why do you take time to do this for me? While assisting with these physical needs, we often have the opportunity to speak with them about a much more significant concern: their spiritual needs."

"Our God provides hope for each of His children. The work being done by NC Baptists on Mission in western North Carolina provides a glimmer of hope for those who experienced damage from Helene. In helping those impacted by the storm, we can also offer eternal hope through belief in our Savior. If not accepted, we have planted the seed that God can water and continue to work with in the future."

## DISIPLESHIP

Most of us get a little antsy when we read "some assembly required" on the side of a box. We've likely learned that phrase may mean anything from five minutes to three hours of searching through parts and trying to identify just which one goes in the right place.

Discipleship is an ever growing and evolving relationship with Christ. When you listen to sermons, scripture or the voice of fellow believers, do you ever walk away wondering just how the new or even old knowledge should be assimilated into your life to continue the transformation into who God wants you to be?

If we go back to "some assembly required", how many times have you been determined to get through those instructions without help no matter how painful? Maybe we know somebody who put one of those things together before and we can get some help. Hmm. No then I'll be perceived as weak. I doubt it though. We'll often find that friends are happy to help and the time we get to spend together benefits both of us. When we hear or read those words that we just can't get to fit into place. Talk to your fellow Christians. Let the relationship grow. You'll be amazed at the growth that follows.

One other thing that comes up in assembly is sometimes we miss something in the small details. In our relationships, we'd call that intimacy. It's challenging to find a friend that we can share those small details with. Certainly we have a friend like that with Jesus and we can ask Him for direction in the smallest and most difficult places our lives may have. It helps too, if we can develop that kind of relationship with a fellow Christian where we can let them be privy to some of our deepest questions and pain. Why? Because it's hard to resolve issues if part of the facts are left out.

The conclusion is as always, we need one another as highlighted by these words from Ecclesiastes 4

- **9** Two are better than one; because they have a good reward for their labour.
- **10** For if they fall, the one will lift up his fellow: but woe to him that is alone when he falleth; for he hath not another to help him up.
- 11 Again, if two lie together, then they have heat: but how can one be warm alone?
- **12** And if one prevail against him, two shall withstand him; and a threefold cord is not quickly broken.
