Pastor's Pen Let us embrace the spirit of the Lord during this Easter season together. Lent is a period of preparation, of fasting and self-denial, of repentance and confession, of putting our spiritual house in order. Lent is about embracing the Resurrected Christ with a whole and longing heart. It involves putting some things away so that we can fully claim all that God offers.

We are called to ponder and embrace Jesus' invitation to follow him. Jesus calls us to leave behind much of what we have known and accepted to join him in a journey that continues through every phase of our lives. The invitation is offered to us not only at the start of the life of faith. It is an offer that is extended to us repeatedly throughout our faithful journey.

We enter the Lenten season 2025 glimpsing the promise of resurrection with renewed strength and promise.

In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus begins his public ministry with these words: "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news" (Mark 1:15). When Jesus talks about the kingdom of God coming near, we nod like we understand. But do we faithfully understand? These days are wilderness days, filled with chaos, uncertainty, and fighting. The flickers of hope we see today seem vastly different from the complete kingdom God promised.

The kingdom of God has come near, Jesus told us. The kingdom of God touches this wilderness road, and we can see it in glimpses throughout the journey. But we must be looking. And we must take the time to not just believe in the good news, but to embody the good news ourselves.

As we travel in this Lenten journey with Jesus to Jerusalem and to the Cross, let us be intent to extend greater mercy and justice into our world. We prepare and journey through prayer, repentance, good work, fasting, and sacrifice. We renew our faith and reflect on Jesus' love—His living, dying, and rising from the dead. He is our Savior and our Lord. He has redeemed us from our sins. He gives us eternal life. That is God's promise to us through Jesus Christ.

<u>DISIPLESHIP</u>

The season of Lent is quickly coming. I realize I may not be alone in expressing a lack of understanding about Lent because in the Baptist Church of days gone by, it wasn't something that got much attention. Other folks talked about giving up this, that or the other thing for Lent only to moan about it while it was going on and then resuming the activity once Lent was over.

Today, I understand Lent is a symbolic representation of Jesus' forty days in the wilderness following His baptism. Then again, if it's only symbolism and a conformation to tradition based on the passage of time, have I found its meaning? Nope. Still not on the mark.

Thinking back, I remember when spring and fall revivals were a BIG deal. That doesn't seem to be the case any longer. However, building on the revival concept, I believe the intent of Lent is very much similar.

Jesus' retreat into the desert was a time of denying the flesh and concentrating on feeding the spirit. Revival isn't a service, it isn't a charismatic event, it's a renewal and refreshment of the relationship with God that is part of the life of every Christian. Then what if we begin to look at Lent in a similar fashion? Should we look forward to enhancing our relationship with God and approach the days of Lent not looking in regret for what we might give up but in hope and anticipation of what we might find in faith?

Lenten devotional booklets are available and you're encouraged to pick one up. As you go through the daily devotionals, slow down. Look for that pearl of knowledge you may have either missed or forgotten and let it find its way into your heart. ~Bill Butler
