

#### DISCIPLESHIP

From Psalm 24 we read, "The earth is the LORD's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein, for he has founded it upon the sea and established it upon the rivers." Please don't stop reading there. Grab a Bible and read through the whole chapter. It will certainly brighten your day to ponder God's greatness and protection.

In the Old Testament, we read about many events where God used nature to accomplish His purposes, while the Bible doesn't specifically say so, it could be that when the walls of Jericho fell that the inhabitants initially thought it to be an earthquake. In three separate passages Exodus 23:28, Deuteronomy 7:20 and Joshua 24:12 we read where God used hornets to drive Israel's adversaries from the land.

Here's the thing, if we were oblivious to God and didn't know of Him or you wanted to dismiss His work as a natural event or happenstance could you? We probably could and many have. If we continued to read Psalm 24, we'd see in verses 5 and 6 where the Lord blesses those who seek His face. Without seeking His face, we become oblivious to His actions. In other words, seeing God in action can only happen through the eyes of faith.

Discipleship is really continuing to seek God's face. It involves others because that's the way God designed it. We need accountability to one another to keep us focused on His will and His way. As we seek God's face, let's also ask what He might be preparing ahead for us so that we might be ready to join in where He has a niche for us in His work, a particular place that is tailor made for each of our talents and capabilities.

Since discipleship does involve relationships, you're encouraged to mark your calendar for November 8. We're scheduling a stew for that date. There can be a lot of fellowship in sharing the effort to make a pot of stew. We'll probably begin the work on Friday evening November 7 and conclude at lunchtime on November 8. While the community will be welcome and encouraged to come and enjoy a bowl of stew and distribution to our shut-ins is a given, none will be offered for sale. ~ Bill Butler
