A Blessed Epiphany Happy New Year

Happy New Year to all of our MHBC families!!! Yes, we have reached another milestone in January 2026! A new season of the church as well as a new year of the calendar. One is a very concrete one, affecting our daily lives directly, our planning for each day of the next year. The other is a "religious" one, an unseeable concept that few people have heard of, even church attenders.

EPIPHANY - a wonderful word, but not one used often in our regular conversation. In terms of meaning, we can go in two directions: ordinary, every day use - **a moment of sudden revelation or insight** - such as "a few years ago I had an epiphany about how I could change my sermons...";

a Christian view - **the manifestation of Christ to the world** - God come to earth just as God promised in the Old Testament. This child - proclaimed by angels, visited by shepherds, sought out by the wise men, is recognized as the Promised One.

Another image of epiphany is that of light breaking into our world, bringing life-changing actions into the lives of all who believe. God made known the birth of the Son by the light of a star. When life is changed, transformed; when life is turned upside down, we realize that we have received more than a life-improvement plan. We have received the gift of transformation.

This prayer, whose author is unknown, spoke to me as a very good reminder and prayer as we start a new year:

Lord, We are your people, the sheep of your flock. Heal the sheep who are wounded, touch the sheep who are in pain, clean the sheep who are soiled, warm the lambs, who are cold. Help us to know the Father's love through Jesus the shepherd and through the Holy Spirit. Help us to lift up that love, and show it all over the land. Help us to build love on justice and justice on love. Help us to believe mightily, hope joyfully, love divinely, renew us that we may help renew the face of the earth. Amen.

DISCIPLESHIP

Certainly, discipleship is rooted in our relationships with one another. Why? It's a matter of sufficient familiarity to be able to confide in brothers and sisters without fear. Lacking a degree of intimacy, each of us instinctively lacks trust in our fellow man. Since sin entered the world at the time of Adam, that would certainly be a reasonable response..

Our acceptance of Christ as savior began our journey toward a new nature. Perhaps Romans 12:2 states this a little better *"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect."* While reading the Bible and praying will take us a long way in that journey, we all hit times when there are tough spots, things we don't understand or we simply fall prey to the carnal mind that continues to live inside us. It's at those times that we need to be able to reveal our weakness to the trusted brothers and sisters with whom we've developed relationships for their prayers and support.

There are times too, when we fall into a sin and just like Adam and Eve who tried to cover themselves with fig leaves, we may make a frail attempt to find another covering to hide behind. For our friends, we have a responsibility which runs contrary to what Cain asked in Genesis. When Cain asked, "Am I my brother's keeper", he had no idea that God's unspoken response would be "YES!". Then again, Cain was attempting to frailly cover with another "fig leaf". For us, the answer is also yes but we've been given some instruction on how that caring should look.

There are a number of verses that tell us how to proceed in assisting a brother or sister but every one of them involves doing that in a spirit of love. How about this from Galatians 6? *"Brothers, if anyone is caught in any transgression, you who are spiritual should restore him in a **spirit of gentleness**. Keep watch on yourself, lest you too be tempted. **2 Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ.**"* Hiding behind a figurative fig leaf is a badge of shame. There's no need for us to pile on guilt and shame. Our job is exhortation. It's our responsibility to help our Christian siblings escape guilt and shame and become productive once again.

May this congregation continue to display this kind of love to all in 2026. In Christ may we find a highly enlightening and productive year! ~ Bill Butler

STEWARDSHIP NEWS

A vote to approve the proposed budget will be taken by secret ballot at a Called Business Meeting on Sunday, January 4, 2026.

At this meeting, the Stewardship Committee will make a recommendation to accept the 2026 proposed budget with one change: Section 6000, Line 3 (Insurance), will be reduced from \$23,000 to \$13,500 due to a change in our insurance provider.

This will reduce the total budget by \$9,500 (Total Budget - \$254,459) and adjust the weekly offering requirement to \$4,894. Thank you to our Treasurer and Trustees for locating ways to reduce our yearly expenses.

Please be in prayer as you consider your tithes and offerings for the coming year.

"Seek And Save"

The prophet Haggai challenged the Jews returning from exile to examine their priorities when he declared "Now this is what the Lord Almighty says 'Give careful thought to your ways. You have planted seed but harvested little. You eat, but never have enough....You put on clothes, but you are not warm. You earn wages only to put them in a purse with holes in it.'"
